The Urban Acre Community Garden

We have been gardening at The Urban Acre for five months and our yield is on the rise again. The suggestion of one of our garden volunteers to plant a fall garden has paid off. On October 31, we harvested 74.5 pounds from the garden and carried it to the CCC for distribution to their clients. The harvest included 37 lbs. of collards, 6.5 lbs. of mustard, 15.5 lbs. of turnip greens, 5.5 lbs. of kale, 2 lbs. of spinach, 2.5 lbs. of lettuce, and 5.5 lbs. of mixed vegetables from the summer garden (tomatoes, peppers, okra, beans, and eggplant). This was the largest one-day harvest to date from our church's garden. We have 15 vines full of fall tomatoes which have not ripened yet, 44 cabbages, and our root crops (sweet potatoes, onions, carrots, and turnips) which are still growing. As these mature and our greens keep producing, November should be our best month by far.

We recalculated some of our earlier harvest totals and are happy to report to you that as of October 31, we have recorded harvesting 987 lbs. of fruit and vegetables from the garden. By the time you read this, we will have harvest records for over 1,000 lbs. We planted the first phase of the garden on May 25 and gathered the first harvest of squash and zucchini on June 16. We did not start weighing and recording our harvest until June 25. The monthly totals are encouraging: June 37.3 lbs.; July 219.7 lbs.; August 278.6 lbs.; September 134 lbs.; October 317.5. Many of us who have gardened for years have not previously taken full advantage of the fall and winter gardening opportunity we have in our climate. The fall garden is producing more in food pounds than the summer garden.

This year the average distance food travels from the place where it was grown to our plates in 1,500 miles. Our community garden is continuing to make a small but important contribution to reducing that distance and therefore increasing food security in our city. If we faced a crisis halting transportation or electricity for a number of days, our hedge against starvation is the food we can see growing in our community. The Urban Acre could not feed the entire community, but it is a sign that we can and we should garden and eat more locally grown food.

If you ever thought gardening was ho-hum or boring, get involved with The Urban Acre Community Garden. It has been an exciting and fulfilling adventure to work and learn alongside members of our church and community and with God the Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer of the fertile soil, the sun, and the rain. We do pray for more rain and are indebted greatly to **Bill and Susie Wiley** for providing abundant water for our garden in addition to the land. Susie will interview our pastor about the success of The Urban Acre and lessons we learned from our first season on her 7:00 a.m. morning show November 17. Be sure to tune in. There will also be time built in for sightseeing and free time as a group. I do not know the total cost of the trip because we don't have flights booked or hotel rooms in NYC. Once we know the number going, we can start securing these pricier things. The trip will be no more than \$1,600 per person. Fundraiser and attendance money will be backed out of the total. **A \$200 deposit to secure your spot, so we can start lining up flights and hotels, is due by Friday, December 2.**

College Visits Beth will plan to visit Auburn University students on Tuesday, November 8 and Troy University on Nov. 9. Parents, if I need to take anything to your students, please let me know!

Senior High Ski Trip, Dec. 27-30 The Senior High will be going to Winterplace, WV December 27-30, 2016 for a Ski Retreat. We will be staying in one slope side house that sleeps up to 27. **The total cost of the trip is \$374 per person.** [\$329 will cover lodging, lift tickets and skis. \$20 covers food to prepare meals in the room. \$25 covers diesel gas in the bus. Non skiers deduct \$117- total \$257.] You will need money for fast food meals in route. **The first payment of \$187 is due November 1. The balance (\$187) is due December 1.**
