"The Use of Money" | A Note From Our Pastor

For three Sundays in November the sermons in both morning worship services will explore Biblical Principles about the use of money on which John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, based his stewardship practice and teaching. He urged the early Methodists to "make all you can, save all you can, and give all you can." His approach was by no means a get rich quick scheme. He opposed the prosperity Gospel that promised material blessings if you have enough faith. However, many poor people in England and beyond who followed Wesley's teaching gained wealth and rose from poverty to economic and social prominence. They helped fund the spread of Methodism throughout the world in the eighteenth century.

You will hear some surprising statements from Wesley's writings about the Christian's disposition toward money. Here are some excerpts from Wesley on stewardship:

- "Gain all you can by honest industry... Do it as soon as possible... Put your whole strength to the work... Leave nothing undone that can be done by labor or patience."
- "Do not throw the precious talent into the sea... Do not throw it away in idle expenses, which is just the same as throwing it into the sea. Expend no part of it merely to gratify the desire of the flesh, the desire of the eye, or the pride of life."
- "Render unto God, not a tenth, not a third, not half, but all that is God's, be it more or less; by employing all on yourself, your household, the household of faith, and all mankind, in such a manner that you may give a good account of your stewardship, when you can be no longer stewards."
- "If you desire to be a faithful and wise steward, out of the portion of the Lord's goods that he has for the present lodged in your hands, but with the right of resuming whenever it pleases him, First, provide things needful for yourself; food to eat, raiment to put on, whatever nature moderately requires for preserving the body in health and strength. Secondly, provide these for your wife, your children, your servants, or any others who pertain to your household. If, when this is done, there is an overplus left, then 'do good to them who are of the household of faith.'"

These are not standard teachings on stewardship we have come to expect this time of year when preachers and finance leaders urge us to underwrite the church's upcoming budget. Stewardship for Wesley is not meeting a legalistic requirement of tithing but rather responding affirmatively to Christ's Gospel call to be his disciples: "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life" (Mark 8:34-37).

Christ followers know that all we have belongs to God. God does not begrudge our providing modestly for ourselves and our families but deplores opulence, and God allows us to experience the joy and freedom of generosity toward those in the household of faith and beyond. Let's learn together to be Biblical stewards in the Wesleyan spirit.


